DISCUSSION

One of the fastest growing areas of microcomputer use is in the field of wide area networking. The advent of the World Wide Web, and the use of associated client applications called web browsers, has permitted millions of non-technical users to access the Internet. This, in turn, has led to a greater need for web-related technical assistance. One of the A+ objectives requires the ability to identify concepts and capabilities relating to the Internet and basic procedures for setting up a system for Internet access. That is the purpose of this lab. The subsequent labs will cover Internet-related topics such as Telnet, FTP, and the Internet domain name system.

The most widely used web browser applications are Microsoft's Internet Explorer (IE) and Netscape's Navigator. Both of these applications are provided free for educational or personal non-commercial use, and can be downloaded from the company's web site. Of course, you will need to have a web browser already installed and configured in order to download these browsers. Fortunately, Windows Me comes with IE already installed as part of the operating system. Using an Internet browser to locate and download applications, demos, drivers, and patches is one of the primary skills needed by every computer technician.



Networking

PROCEDURE

In this lab procedure you will configure your network Internet browser and e-mail clients. In order to fill in some of these parameters, you will need to acquire information from your ISP, instructor, or network administrator. Then you will browse the Internet using the Internet Explorer 5.0 (IE5) web browser, as depicted in Figure 38-1. You will then configure your e-mail client (Outlook Express) and check your e-mail.

If you are working in a classroom environment, it may be necessary to uninstall these features from the system for the next class. In this case, consult with your instructor before uninstalling anything from the system.

NOTE: Your computer will react differently if you have a dial-up networking connection (modem) versus a LAN or DSL connection. The following lab will include the proper procedure for both types of network connections.

1. Record the configuration information for your Internet network connection

- a. Boot the computer to Windows Me.
- ____b. Record the Internet configuration information you received from your instructor, network administrator, or ISP in Table 38-1.

2. Run Internet Explorer

- a. Double-click the Internet Explorer icon on your desktop.
- ____b. If you are using a LAN or DSL connection, skip to Step c. If you are using dial-up networking, click the Connect button in the *Connect To* window.

c.	In the <u>Windows Me - Microsoft Internet Explorer</u> window, click the Maximize button in the upper right corner.
d.	Click on Help in the menu bar and select About Internet Explorer from the Help menu.
e.	Record the current version number in Table 38-2, then click the OK button to close the About

f.	In the <u>Windows Me - Microsoft Internet Explorer</u> window, click the Close button in the upper right corner.
g.	If you are using a LAN or DSL connection, skip to Step 3. If you are using dial-up networking, click the "Don't use Auto-Disconnect" check box to select it, then click the Stay Connected button.

a.	Click the Internet Explorer icon in the lower left corner of the System Tray to re-open IE.
—_b.	Click the Start button and select Run from the Start menu.
c.	In the Open box, type www.arstechnica.com, and then click the OK button.

f.	When the page finishes downloading, press the F11 function key to view the full screen image.




Figure 38-2: Use Yahoo/Mapquest to Locate Marcraft's Main Office

- g. Under Tools, click the hyperlink labeled <u>Driving Directions To this location</u>.
 h. Enter the address of your current location in the Enter a Starting Address section.
 i. Click the Get Directions button.
- 1. Record the distance to Marcraft in Table 38-4.




Figure 38-3: The E-mail Server Names Window

6. Configuring the Outlook Express e-mail client

- a. Double-click the Outlook Express icon on the desktop. The *Internet Connection Wizard* window should appear.
- b. Enter your name as listed in Table 38-1a into the Display name box, then click the Next button.
- ___c. Enter your e-mail address as listed in Table 38-1f into the E-mail address box, then click the Next button.
- ___d. Enter your POP3 server address as listed in Table 38-1g into the Incoming mail box.
 - e. Enter your SMTP server address as listed in Table 38-1j into the Outgoing mail box. The *E-mail Server Names configuration* window should appear similar to Figure 38-3. Click the Next button to continue.
 - ___f. Enter your POP3 Login Name as listed in Table 38-1h into the Account name box.
 - g. Enter your POP3 password as listed in Table 38-1 into the Password box, then click the Next button.
- h. Click the Finish button to continue.

7. Use and configure the Outlook Express e-mail client

- _a. Click the Maximize button in the upper right corner.
- b. Click the Send/Receive button in the toolbar.




Figure 38-4: The Outlook Express E-mail Client

- ___c. If you are using a LAN or DSL connection, skip to Step d. If you are using dial-up networking, click the Connect button in the <u>Connect To</u> window. The <u>Outlook Express</u> e-mail client window should appear similar to Figure 38-4.

- __d. Click on Tools in the menu bar and select Options from the Tools menu.
- e. Click the Maintenance tab in the *Options* window.




Figure 38-5: Delete Unwanted Mail on Exit

- f. Click the check box to select Empty messages from the DELETED ITEMS folder on exit as shown in Figure 38-5.
- g. Click the OK button.
- ___h. Close Outlook Express.

8. Configure the Internet Explorer browser

- a. Click the Internet Explorer icon in the lower left corner of the System Tray to open IE.
- b. Press the F11 function key to return to standard view.
- c. Click the Address box and type www.zdnet.com/zdnn/ and press the ENTER key.
- d. On the Tools menu, click Internet Options.
- e. Click the General tab under Home page, then click the Use Current button.
- f. Click the Apply button to make ZDNet News your home page.
- g. Click the Advanced tab.




Figure 38-6: Select AutoComplete

- h. Scroll down to locate the Use inline AutoComplete function, and then click the check box to select it. Your options should now appear similar to those shown in Figure 38-6.

- i. Click the OK button to turn on AutoComplete.
- j. Exit the *Internet Options* window.
- k. Close all open windows and shut down the computer.
