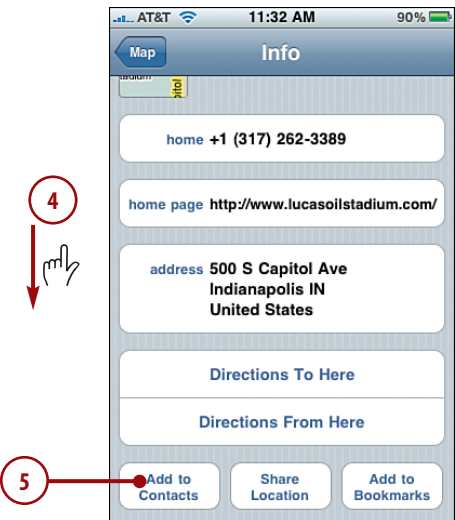
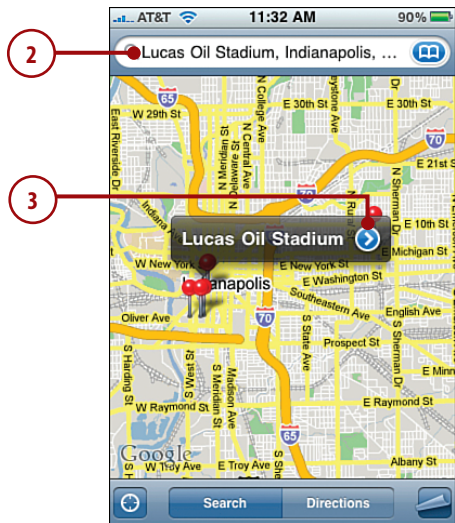


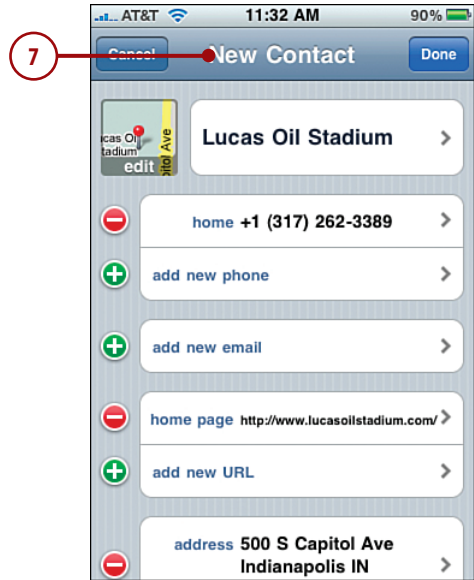
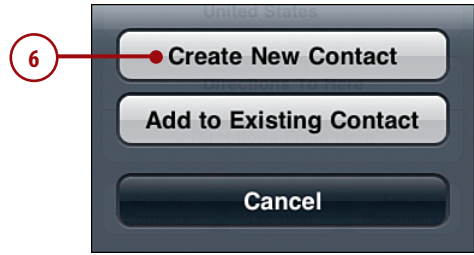
Creating a Contact from a Map

When you view a location on a map, you can create a contact with that location's information.

1. On the Home screen, tap Maps.
2. Use the map to find a location. (Chapter 14, "Using Pre-installed Applications," covers the Maps application).
3. Tap the Info button for the location. The Info screen appears.
4. Scroll down the screen until you see the Add to Contacts button.
5. Tap Add to Contacts.

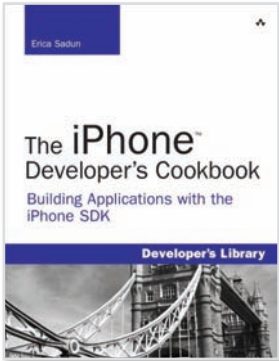


6. Tap Create New Contact. The New Contact screen appears. iPhone adds as much information as it can based on the location, such as name, phone number, address, website, and so on.
7. Use the New Contact screen to configure the new contact. This works just like when you create a new contact manually, except that you already have information for the new contact, in this case, the location name (if it has one), address, and so on. See “Creating Contacts on an iPhone Manually,” next for details.

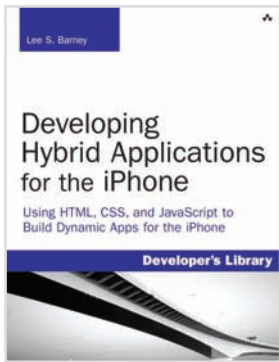
