With these challenges in mind, Stephanie Carhee created *The Road to IP Telephony: How Cisco Systems Migrated from PBX to IP Telephony*. Recently featured in the Second Quarter 2004 issue of *Packet*, Carhee contributed an article compiling her top 10 tips for project management of an enterprise-wide IP Telephony migration.

It requires a careful combination of the right products, people, processes, tools, services, best practices, and methodologies—all working in concert."

Stephanie Carhee is a senior project manager with the Cisco IP Communications Services Marketing team. With more than 15 years of project management experience, Carhee was an IT project manager for voice services in the Strategic Program Management Group and was team lead for the Cisco migration to IP Telephony, the largest deployment of its kind in the industry to date.

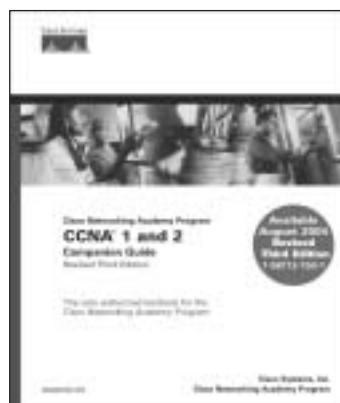
