PHILADELPHIA

The nation's fifth largest city, Philadelphia is located in southeast Pennsylvania between the Schuylkill and Delaware Rivers, in Philadelphia County. The entire metro area, made up of Bucks, Montgomery, Chester, Delaware, and Philadelphia counties, is a major center for pharmaceutical/biotech, healthcare, communications, and financial services industries. Comcast, QVC, Bethlehem Steel, and Sunoco are all headquartered in Philadelphia. The major business districts in Philadelphia are **Center City** and the **University District**.

Center City is the home of many of Philadelphia's corporate offices, best hotels and restaurants, and the Convention Center District. It is also home to the Philadelphia Stock Exchange and Federal Reserve Bank. Chinatown, a popular dining destination, lies adjacent to the Convention Center District. The **University District**, located 2 miles west of Center City across the Schuylkill River, is home to the University of Pennsylvania, Drexel University, and a diverse community of educational, cultural, technological, and entertainment organizations.

GETTING THERE

PHILADELPHIA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Philadelphia International Airport is located on the Delaware River approximately 7 miles south of downtown Philadelphia, just off I-95. A sprawling airport situated on 2,302 acres, Philadelphia International consists of six concourses—A, B, C, D, E, and F. Each concourse has its own terminal except concourses B and C that share terminal B/C, which houses the Philadelphia Marketplace. Construction on the new International Terminal (A West—which will connect to the existing concourse A) is expected to be completed in 2003.

Numerous moving sidewalks are located throughout this large airport to speed you along your way. Traveling from one end of the airport to the other on the moving walk-ways will take about 15 minutes, assuming that you don't stop to rest at the rocking chairs near terminal B/C. If you are flying US Airways Express with a connecting flight from terminal C to terminal F, a shuttle bus will transport you between terminals. The pickup and drop-off is located within concourses C and F past ticketing.

Short-term parking lots are located on ground level at baggage claims A, B, C, and D. Garage parking lots (hourly and long-term) are off the Arriving Flights Roadway.

There is no shortage of convenient places to eat and shop at the airport, which houses more than 100 restaurants and retail stores—a third of which are in the Philadelphia Marketplace, a large retail mall. Food courts are located in terminal B/C and near concourse F. Other restaurants are located in the concourses and the walkways between the concourses. Restaurants include Gloria Jean's Coffee (Marketplace), Hudson News Euro Cyber Café (D86), Jet Rock Bar and Grill (B8, C25, D11, F9), Lamberti's International (before security in concourse D), the Petit Bistro (C31), and Philadelphia Tavern (A4). In addition, the on-airport Marriott Hotel offers the Riverbend Bar and Grill, which is open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Retail stores in the Philadelphia Marketplace include Barbara's Bestsellers, Bath and Body Works, Brookstone, Cingular Wireless, Fossil Shop, Gap, Godiva Chocolates, Museum Shop, PGA Tour Shop, and Sunglass Hut. (A complete list of retailers is located at www.philamarketplace.com.Also look for Food & Shops pamphlets peppered throughout the airport.) In addition, Staples Express is located in concourse

B, and MailBoxes, Etc. is in the walkway between concourses A and B.

INTERNET ACCESS

Dial-up/data ports: Data ports are located in every terminal, in the gate area next to the pay phones. The Airport Marriott has data ports for public use on the second floor.

High-speed access: The Euro Cyber Café in terminal D offers kiosks for high-speed Internet access and dial-up access for laptops. High-speed access is also available at Laptop Lane in the terminal A/B link.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION

Ground transportation counters, which provide information for all means of transportation at the airport, are located in all baggage claim areas. Outside each baggage claim area are Zones 1-7, each representing a different transportation method.

Rental Cars

Information phones are available at all baggage claim areas for each of the on-airport car rental agencies. All rental car companies provide shuttle service from Zone 2, outside the baggage claim area, to their pickup locations.

Taxis

Taxis are located in Zone 5 outside each terminal baggage claim area. Cabs charge a \$20 flat rate to Center City. There is usually no wait for a cab.

Limousines

Car service pickup is at Zone 7. Companies are listed at the ground transportation counters. Most companies require reservations. After you arrive, call the company for the ground transportation counter; drivers usually arrive in 5 minutes. The fare to Center City is about \$50. Major companies include Transline Airport One (2800.535.5466) and USA Limousine (2800.872.6070); call the airport's main number for a list of additional companies.

Share-Ride Shuttles

Reservations are not necessary. Shuttle pickup is in Zone 7. Share-ride information is available at the ground transportation counters. Major companies include Lady Liberty (2 215.724.8888) and USA Limousine (2 800.872.6070); check the ground transportation board for a list of providers and their extension numbers. When you call, the service will pick you up in 10 to 12 minutes. The ride to the city will take about 30 minutes. Shuttles cost about \$8/person. Shuttles stop at all terminals outside baggage claims.

Public Transportation

The SEPTA R1 High Speed Rail Line provides service to Philadelphia. The R1 runs through the center of the airport, with entrances on each of the pedestrian bridges at each terminal outside baggage claim (except terminal F). The train takes about 15 to 20 minutes to get to Center City; one-way fare is \$5.50. The train leaves every half hour. Time schedules are available at the ground transportation centers.

AMTRAK

If you are traveling between Philadelphia, New York, Baltimore, or Washington, Amtrak can be a much more convenient option than driving or flying.

Amtrak has 11 trains that serve Philadelphia, including Acela and Metroliner service to New York City, Boston, and Washington, DC. Depending on the train, a trip from Philadelphia to New York Penn Station runs approximately 1 hour 15 minutes; the trip to Washington Union Station runs from 1 1/2 to 2 hours. Budget and National both have rental car offices at the 30th Street Station.

DRIVING, PARKING, AND WALKING

Philadelphia is a sprawling city, but the Center City business district is compact and easy to traverse by foot. Center City is laid out in a grid pattern with City Hall in the middle; the Center City area covers a 1-mile radius around City Hall. Blocks are short and easy to navigate; numbered streets run parallel to each other whereas streets with names run perpendicular to numbered streets.

University City is about 2 miles due west of Center City and is easily reached by cab or public transportation. If you are walking around University City and need help finding your way, look for a UCD Ambassador, dressed in a gold and blue uniform.

The main north-south highways through Philadelphia are the Delaware Expressway (I-95) and the Schuylkill Expressway (I-76). The Ben Franklin Bridge (a toll bridge) connects Philadelphia to southern New Jersey and the New Jersey Turnpike.

Driving into and around Center City, although easy to navigate, is sometimes difficult—due primarily to traffic congestion on narrow streets, especially during rush hour. The Schuylkill Expressway is often tied up for miles. But overall, Philadelphia traffic is mild compared to most major cities. Count on adding an extra 25% in travel time during rush hour.

RULES OF THE ROAD

The maximum speed limit on interstate highways and other limited access roads is 65 m.p.h., unless otherwise posted. The speed limit on other highways is 55 m.p.h. Headlight use is required in rain, fog, snow, and so on. Pennsylvania law requires that the driver and all frontseat passengers wear seat belts. Violation of the seat belt law is a secondary offense.

PARKING

Philadelphia has metered street parking for a maximum of 2 hours. It's better to leave your car in a garage or lot; lot/garage parking costs around \$15/day, and parking lots are plentiful.

TAXIS

If you're doing business in Center City, hailing a cab may be unnecessary because most locations are easy to get to by foot. Taxis are generally easy to hail on the street and can be found at any hotel. Fares start at \$1.80, and each mile runs \$1.80. If you're doing business in the suburbs, you'll need to call a cab. Major cab companies include City Cab Company, Inc., (2215.492.6600) and Quaker City Cab, Inc., (2215.728.8000).

RENTAL CARS

Avis, Budget, Enterprise, and Hertz all have offices within a 1-mile radius of Center City.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

SouthEastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA 215.580.7800 www.septa.org) runs Regional Rail lines, subways, trolleys, and buses throughout the Philadelphia metro area. The R1 regional rail line, which runs from the airport, has stops in University City and at the 30th Street Amtrak Station, as well as at two downtown locations—Suburban Station (16th and JFK Blvd.) and Market East/The Gallery (the Pennsylvania Convention Center). Fares run from \$3 to \$7; trains run every half hour.

If you're traveling between University City and Central City, use the Market–Frankford subway line. Enter at 11th Street and Market, one block west of the Convention Center. The trolley also runs from University City to Center City. Enter at 13th and Market, three blocks west of the Convention Center. Both the subway and trolley run every 5 to 10 minutes and have a number of stops in the northern area of University City.

In downtown Philly, bright purple PHLASH buses run a downtown loop. Bus and subway services require exact fares of \$2. The LUCY (Loop Thru University City @www.ucityphila.com) has shuttle bus service running from the 30th Street Station to all the major institutions in University City for a \$2 base fare.

The Reading Terminal Headhouse at Market Street serves as the entrance to the Center, linking the Convention Center to Market East Rail Station. To the east, the Headhouse connects to the Gallery at Market East, a four-level shopping center that spans three blocks. The Convention Center is also attached to the Reading Terminal Market, a 100 year-old farmer's market. And finally, the Headhouse serves as a secondary entrance to the Marriott Hotel, which occupies the upper floors of the Headhouse and an adjacent city block (accessed via a pedestrian bridge). Parking is available in the numerous lots and garages that surround the Center.
