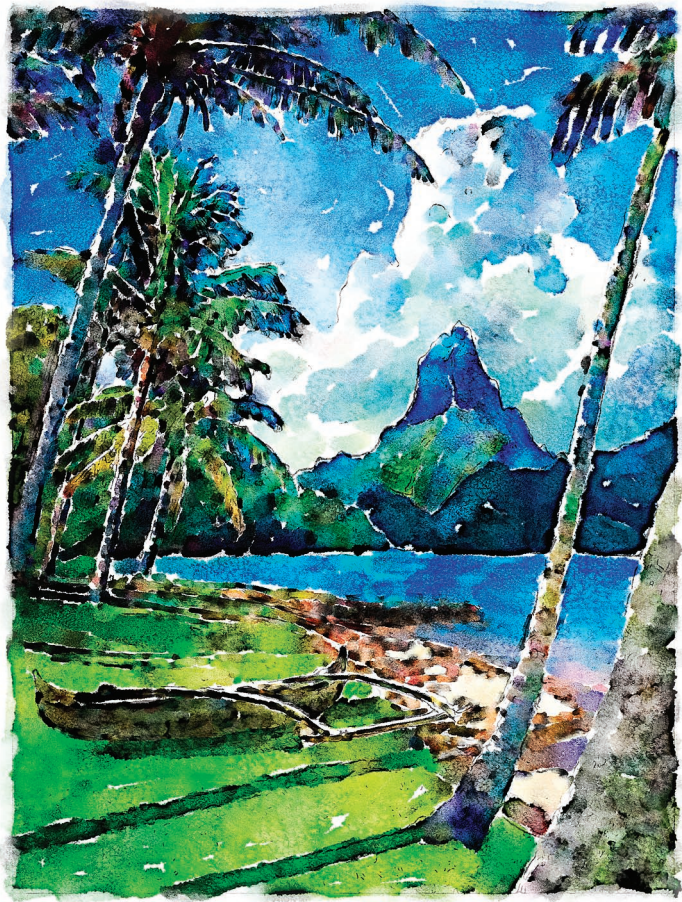
Creativity and Craftsmanship are key components of the artist's balancing act. The skills used to execute the tools at hand extend the vision that is within the heart.

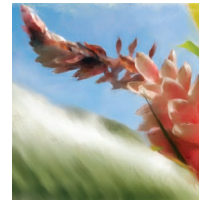

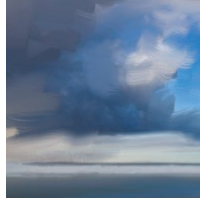
