518	"A Tour of Forms" section	<p>The following Note reader aid should be added directly after the heading:</p> <p>NOTE After opening the contacts.accdb file, you might encounter an error that states that the database has a missing or broken reference to the file msadox.dll. The reference to msadox.dll is incorrect in the contacts.accdb sample database. This error might affect form functions. Use the following instructions to fix the problem:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Start Access 2007 and open the contacts.accdb database. An error appears, stating that the file msadox.dll is missing and it may be needed for the database to function correctly. 2. Click OK until the error message stops appearing and you're at the main screen in Access that displays the contents of the database on the left side. 3. At the top of the screen, click the Database Tools tab. 4. At the far left of the menu that appears, click Visual Basic. The Microsoft Visual Basic – Contacts window opens. 5. On the menu bar, click the Tools menu, and then click References. The References – Contacts window opens. 6. Under Available References is a list of references that are needed for the database. Notice that one of the references reads "MISSING - Microsoft ADO Ext. 6.0 for DLL and Security." Clear the check box to the left of this reference. 7. Scroll the Available References list until you find the Microsoft ADO Ext. 2.8 For DDL And Security reference. 8. Select the Microsoft ADO Ext. 2.8 For DDL And Security check box. If you do not have this reference listed, you might need to install Microsoft Data Access Components (MDAC) 2.8, which can be found here. 9. In the References – Contacts window, click OK. 10. In the Microsoft Visual Basic – Contacts window, click File, and then click Save Contacts. Click File, and then click Close And Return To Microsoft Office Access. 11. You should now be able to use the contacts.accdb database without issue. If other errors appear after this, click OK; they should not affect the use of the database.
