When Apple announced the original iPad back in 2010, the company's iconic CEO, the late Steve Jobs (1955–2011), referred to the tablet device as "magical." That was the start of a technological revolution that has since captured the imaginations of iPad users around the world, and for Apple, it has resulted in tens of millions of iPad units sold each subsequent year.

Just as the iPad itself has evolved a lot in just a few years, so have the ways people are using their tablet on-the-job. Thus, this all-new fourth edition of *Your iPad at Work* is intended to help you quickly get up and running using the iOS 7 operating system, plus introduce you to some of the ways success-driven people are using their tablets as powerful communications, productivity, and organization tools.



**NOTE** In September 2013, Apple released iOS 7, the newest version of the operating system used exclusively by Apple's mobile devices. As you're about to discover, iOS 7 offers a redesigned user interface and updated look. It also includes a vast selection of new and more-advanced features; better integration with Apple's iCloud service; and enhanced capabilities for sharing app-specific content with others via email, instant message, Facebook, or Twitter. Plus, iOS 7 features an improved version of Siri, which provides an alternative way to interact with the tablet using your voice.

This book covers all of the latest iPad and iPad mini model that are capable of running iOS 7, including the iPad 2, iPad with Retina Display, iPad Air, iPad mini and iPad mini with Retina Display.

## **UNBOXING YOUR NEW iPAD**

If you've purchased your iPad during or after September 2013, it came with Apple's iOS 7 operating system preinstalled. This operating system includes a robust collection of apps that are designed to handle the core tasks you'll probably be using your tablet for. With a quick visit to the online-based App Store, however, you can greatly enhance the capabilities of your iPad by acquiring optional apps for it.

If you've purchased your iPad prior to September 2013, you need to upgrade it to the iOS 7 operating system. How to do this is explained in Chapter 1, "Activating and Personalizing Your Tablet." Keep in mind, if you're using a first-generation iPad model, it is not compatible with iOS 7.

**NOTE** Read more about finding, acquiring, and installing apps in Chapter 10, "Finding and Installing Apps from the App Store," and learn more about many popular business-related apps worth checking out in Chapter 15, "Discovering 'Must-Have' Business Apps." When you take the iPad out of the box for the very first time, its battery should be close to fully charged and be ready for you to activate and set up. Whether the iPad you're about to activate is your first or you're upgrading to a newer model, plan on spending at least 15–30 minutes getting your new tablet up and running. The activation and setup process is described within Chapter 1.

**NOTE** Just about all of the information within this book relates to all of the latest iPad and iPad mini models, and the term "iPad" refers to all iPad and iPad mini models capable of running iOS 7. However, if an iPad model with cellular data Internet connectivity (using a 3G or 4G LTE Internet connection) is required, as opposed to an iPad model with just Wi-Fi Internet connectivity, this is specified.

## **CHOOSING THE RIGHT IPAD TO MEET YOUR NEEDS**

All current iPad models come in several different system configurations. To begin, you need to choose a color casing. Depending on the iPad model, your options include black, white, "space gray" or silver. You also need to decide how much internal storage space you want or need. Your options include 16GB, 32GB, 64GB, or in some cases 128GB.

Keep in mind that iPads are not upgradable in terms of internal storage space or their microprocessor, so you must anticipate your needs before purchasing a tablet.

Finally, you must choose between a Wi-Fi only and a Wi-Fi + Cellular model. This determines how your tablet connects to the Internet and whether or not you need to pay a monthly fee for Internet access. While a Wi-Fi–only model saves you money over the long term, it limits how and where you can access the Internet.

The iPad itself, as well as many apps you use with the tablet often, relies heavily on Internet access. So, depending on how you plan to use your tablet, you may discover that having a cellular data connection (via a 3G or 4G LTE wireless data service) is essential.

**NOTE** A Wi-Fi–only iPad can connect to the Internet from any Wi-Fi hotspot or network. However, you must remain within the radius of a Wi-Fi signal to maintain the Internet connection. A Wi-Fi + Cellular iPad model can also connect to the wireless data network offered by a wireless data service provider, such as AT&T Wireless, Verizon Wireless, T-Moblie, or Sprint PCS in the United States. A cellular data connection requires paying a monthly fee, which includes a predetermined amount of wireless data usage, such as 2GB per month. If you go beyond your monthly wireless data allocation, you are billed extra (per megabyte or gigabyte, depending on your wireless service provider) for use.

## **iPAD HARDWARE CONFIGURATIONS**

The older iPad 2 models feature a 9.7-inch LED-backlit display that offers 1024-by-768 resolution at 132 pixels per inch. They run using Apple's A5 processor. The iPad 2 measures 9.50 inches by 7.31 inches by .34 inches and weighs between 1.33 and 1.35 pounds (depending on the configuration).

The now outdated iPad with Retina Display models feature a more advanced 9.7-inch LED-backlit display. These displays offer 2048-by-1536 resolution at 264 pixels per inch, so they're capable of showcasing much more detailed graphics and more vibrant colors. These iPad models run using Apple's A6X processor and weigh between 1.44 and 1.46 pounds (depending on the configuration).

The new iPad Air (which became available in November 2013) also features a 9.7-inch Retina display, but is thinner and lighter than any previously released full-size iPad. It weights just one pound and is just 7.5 millimeters thick. What also sets the iPad Air apart from its predecessor is its speed. Using the Apple A7 chip, it runs twice as fast as the iPad with Retina Display and eight times faster than the original iPad.

The iPad mini models feature a 7.9-inch LED backlit display. These displays offer a 1024-by-768 resolution at 163 pixels per inch. The iPad mini measures 7.87 inches by 5.3 inches by 0.28 inches, weighs between 0.68 and 0.69 pounds (depending on the configuration), and runs using Apple's A5 processor.

The newest iPad mini with Retina Display not only dramatically improves upon the clarity and resolution of the Multi-Touch display, like the iPad Air, it runs using Apple's cutting-edge A7 processor.

Some people prefer the iPad mini or iPad mini with Retina Display because it's smaller and lighter but runs all of the same apps as the full-size iPad models.

**NOTE** All of the latest iPad models, including the new iPad Air and iPad mini with Retina Display, include Lightning Port, while the iPad second- and third-generation iPad with Retina Display utilizes the older 30-pin connector port. All models have an average battery life of between 9 and 10 hours and have Bluetooth and AirPlay functionality built in.

For a more detailed comparison between iPad and iPad mini models from a technical standpoint, visit www.apple.com/ipad/compare.

**NOTE** Apple no longer sells most configurations of the iPad 2 and has phased out the iPad with Retina Display in favor of the iPad Air. However, iPad 2 models in several different configurations are still available on the secondary used market or as refurbished iPads. These older models can be purchased on eBay.com, for example, starting around \$200.00.

In addition to the price of the tablet itself, you might want to invest in an optional Apple Smart Cover for your tablet (\$39.00 for the polyurethane edition or \$69.00 for the leather edition) or an Apple Smart Case (\$49.00 in polyurethane), as well as the AppleCare+ extended warranty (\$99.99 for two years of coverage). A selection of leather and Polyurethane Smart Covers and Smart Cases are available for the iPad Air and iPad mini that come in a different assortment of colors.

# PREINSTALLED APPS ON ALL iPADS RUNNING iOS 7.0

Each iPad tablet comes bundled with a handful of preinstalled apps. Here's a quick rundown of each app (listed in alphabetical order) that you can begin using as soon as your iPad is activated (see Figure I.1).

If you're a veteran iPad or iPhone user who is upgrading to iOS 7 for the first time, notice that the Home screen, as well as many of app icons displayed on it, has a new look.

- App Store: Find, purchase, download, and install apps directly from your iPad. To learn more, see Chapter 10.
- Calendar: Manage your schedule on your iPad and sync data with iCloud and other calendar/scheduling apps on your Mac, PC, and/or iPhone. To learn more, see Chapter 4, "Using the Calendar and Clock Apps to Organize Your Life."
- Camera: Take photos or shoot high-definition videos using your iPad's builtin cameras. Learn more about taking, editing, viewing, sharing digital photos, and shooting video using your iPad in Chapter 9, "Digital Photography on the iPad."



The iPad's Home screen with the preinstalled app icons displayed. This is what the Home screen looks like shortly after you activate the iPad.

- Clock: This app serves as an alarm clock, world clock, and timer. Learn more about it in Chapter 4.
- Contacts: Manage your personal contacts database and sync it with iCloud or other contact management apps on your primary computer and/or iPhone. To learn more, see Chapter 5, "Working with the Contacts App."
- FaceTime: Participate in free, real-time video calls from your iPad using a Wi-Fi Internet connection. Depending on your wireless service provider, FaceTime may also now be available using a 3G or 4G (LTE) Internet connection. To learn more, see Chapter 14, "Conducting Videoconferences and Virtual Meetings."
- Game Center: This is an interactive, online-based community for participating in multiplayer games via your iPad. You can compete against and communicate with other players from around the world and experience a variety of Game Center-compatible games.
- Mail: Send and receive emails, plus manage your message archive. iOS 7 offers a handful of useful new features for effectively managing your email accounts, including your iCloud-related email account. For more information, see Chapter 3, "Staying In Touch Using Email and Instant Messages."

- Maps: Use this app to access traditional onscreen maps, satellite maps, and even 3D maps of almost any location on the planet, plus obtain real-time turn-by-turn directions (with related traffic condition information) when your iPad is connected to the Web. You can also look up addresses for companies, restaurants, popular destinations (such as airports), and landmarks. Chapter 8, "Exploring Your World with the Maps App," focuses on how to use this versatile app.
- Messages: Send and receive text messages for free using iMessage to communicate with other Mac, iPad, iPhone, or iPod touch users. For more information, see Chapter 3.
- Multimedia: Acquire music, TV shows, movies, audiobooks, and other iTunes Store content directly from your iPad.
- Music: Listen to music, audiobooks, and other audio content acquired from the iTunes Store and elsewhere.
- Newsstand: Acquire and read digital editions of newspapers and magazines. To learn more, see Chapter 16, "Staying Informed Using iBooks and Newsstand."
- Notes: Create, organize, share, and print text-based memos with this basic text editor. Learn more about it from Chapter 6, "Managing Information Using the Reminders and Notes Apps."
- Photo Booth: Take and share photos on your iPad with whimsical themes.
- Photos: View, edit, print, and share photos stored on your iPad. For enhanced photo-editing capabilities, use Apple's optional iPhoto app for the iPad. Learn more about Photos in Chapter 9.
- Reminders: Manage detailed to-do lists with this powerful app. Like many other of the iPad's preinstalled apps, it works seamlessly with iCloud for syncing data with Macs or other iOS devices (including your iPhone). To learn more, see Chapter 6.
- **Safari:** Use this app to surf the Web. To learn more, see Chapter 7, "Surfing the Web with Safari."
- Settings: Use this app to customize the settings of your iPad and personalize how it functions. More information about Settings is offered within Chapter 1.
- Videos: Watch TV shows, movies, and other video content on your iPad that was acquired from the iTunes Store.

**NOTE** Siri, Control Center, and Notification Center work continuously in the background if activated. These features work in conjunction with most other apps.

## OPTIONAL "MUST-HAVE" iPAD APPS DEVELOPED BY APPLE

The following apps developed by Apple (or its partners) do not come preinstalled with iOS 7, but you should seriously consider downloading them from the App Store to enhance the capabilities of your tablet:

**NOTE** If you purchase a new iPad after September 2013, the iWork apps (Pages, Numbers, and Keynote), along with iPhoto and iMovie, are free to download.

- Facebook (Free): The ability to update your Facebook status has been integrated into iOS 7; however, to fully manage your Facebook account and communicate with your Facebook friends, you need to use this free app.
- Find My iPhone (Free): Take advantage of iCloud's Find My... feature from this app to pinpoint the exact location of your other compatible Apple equipment, including your Mac(s) and iPhone. This app offers an alternative to visiting www.iCloud.com/#find to locate your lost or stolen equipment. You can also remotely lock down or erase the contents of your tablet if it falls into the wrong hands.
- Find My Friends (Free): Discover the location of friends, family, or co-workers who are using an iPhone or iPad, in real time. The other person's permission is required.
- Garage Band (Free): Compose and record music using your iPad, and transform the tablet into a multitrack recording studio.
- iBooks (Free): Acquire and read eBooks from Apple's iBookstore on your tablet. To learn more, see Chapter 16.
- iMovie (Free): Edit professional-quality videos on your iPad using footage shot with the tablet's built-in camera (and the Camera app) or footage transferred into your tablet from other sources.
- **iPhoto** (Free): View, edit, organize, print, and share digital photos on your iPad. This app offers far more advanced image-editing features than the Photos app that comes preinstalled on the tablet. The optional iPhoto app

fully integrates with iCloud's My Photo Stream and Shared Photo Stream features, which makes it easy to publish photos online and share them with other people, for free.

- Keynote (Free): Part of Apple's iWork trio of apps, Keynote is a featurepacked digital slide presentation tool, similar in functionality (and compatible with) to Microsoft PowerPoint.
- Numbers (Free): Also part of Apple's iWork trio of apps, Numbers is a powerful spreadsheet-management application compatible with Microsoft Excel.
- Pages (Free): This is a full-featured word processor that is compatible with Microsoft Word. It rounds out the iWork app trio.
- Twitter (Free): Manage one or more Twitter accounts from your iPad, and send tweets from within apps such as Photos or Safari.
- Podcasts (Free): Download or stream thousands of free audio podcasts which you can listen to on an on-demand basis.
- iTunes U (Free): Access thousands of free personal-enrichment programs, college courses, and other interactive and educational multimedia content created by the world's leading educational institutions, museums, and philanthropic organizations.

**NOTE** Pages, Keynote, and Numbers all seamlessly integrate with Apple's iCloud service, making it easy to automatically synchronize data, documents, and files between your tablet, Mac, PC and other iOS devices. You can also access online versions of the iWork apps from www.icloud.com, after logging in using your Apple ID and password.

To learn more about Apple's iWork for iPad apps, see Chapter 13, "Getting Work Done On-the-Go Using the iWork Apps."

## THE ANATOMY OF THE iPAD MODELS

When you look at the front of the iPad, you see its multitouch display. The frontfacing camera is located at the top center of the tablet, and you can find the iPad's Home button at the bottom of the tablet, front and center. Other ports and buttons can be found on the top, bottom, and side of the iPad (shown in Figure I.2).

Aside from these few buttons and ports, you do everything while using your iPad via the tablet's multitouch display. To properly navigate around your tablet via this touch screen, you must utilize several simple finger gestures and movements, as well as the tablet's virtual keyboard.

## USING THE MULTITOUCH DISPLAY

From the moment you turn on your iPad (or take it out of Sleep Mode), aside from pressing the Home button to return to the Home screen at any time, virtually all of your interaction with the tablet is done through the following finger movements and taps on the tablet's highly sensitive multi-touch display:

Tapping: Tapping an icon or link that's displayed on your iPad's screen serves the same purpose as clicking the mouse when you use your main computer. And, just as when you use a computer, you can single-tap or double-tap, which is equivalent to a single- or double-click of the mouse.

- Hold: Instead of a quick tap, in some cases, it is necessary to press and hold your finger on an icon or onscreen command option. When a hold action is required, place your finger on the appropriate icon or command option and hold it there. There's never a need to press down hard on the tablet's screen.
- Swipe: A swipe refers to quickly moving a finger along the screen from right to left, left to right, top to bottom, or bottom to top, in order to scroll to the left, right, down, or up.

**TIP** Regardless of what you're doing on your iPad, as long as it's turned on, to access Notification Center, swipe your finger downward from the very top of the screen. To access the new Control Center, swipe your finger in an upward direction from the very bottom of the screen.

To access iOS 7's Spotlight Search feature from the Home screen in order to quickly find content or data stored on your tablet, swipe your finger downward, starting from the center of the screen (shown in Figure I.3).

To quickly find content stored on your iPad, use the Spotlight Search feature. To access it from the Home screen, swipe your finger downwards, starting near the center of the display.

- Pinch: Using your thumb and index finger, perform a pinch motion on the touch screen to zoom out when using certain apps. Or, un-pinch (move your fingers apart quickly) to zoom in on what you're looking at on the screen when using most apps.
- Grab: Using all five of your fingers, start with them spread out on the tablet's screen, and then quickly bring them together in a grabbing motion. This immediately returns you to the iPad's Home screen (instead of pressing the Home button).
- Four-Finger Swipe: Using all of your fingers on one hand (except your thumb), swipe left or right to switch between apps that are currently running.

**TIP** To access iOS 7's multitasking bar (shown in Figure I.4), quickly press the Home button twice. When you close an app, in most cases it continues running until it's manually shut down or the tablet is powered off. While it's possible to only use one app at a time, multiple apps can continue to run in the background simultaneously, and you can switch between them with ease.

**NOTE** Another way to zoom in or out when looking at the iPad's screen is to double-tap the area of the screen you want to zoom in on.

## **EXPLORING THE iPAD'S HOME SCREEN**

The Home screen on your iPad serves as a central hub from which you can launch individual apps and use the various features and functions of your tablet. Regardless of what you're doing on your tablet, or which app you're using, at any time you can return to the Home screen by pressing the Home button on the frontbottom of the tablet.

See Figure I.5 for a sample Home screen that displays a handful of preinstalled apps, as well as a customized wallpaper in the background.

Shown here is the iPad's Home screen and the sampling of the icons displayed along the top of the screen.

Within the main area of the Home screen are all of the icons for apps currently installed on your iPad. On the main iPad Home screen, you can simultaneously display 20 app icons (or folder icons, which are explained shortly), plus an additional 6 app icons on the very bottom of the screen. You also can have multiple Home screens with different app icons displayed on each. From the main Home screen, swipe your finger from right to left (or left to right) to switch between Home screens, if applicable. It's also possible to press the Home button to immediately switch to the main Home screen.

**NOTE** You can choose to display up to six app icons at the very bottom of the Home screen. These icons remain constant, regardless of which Home screen you're looking at. Thus, you should select the apps you use the most and place their icons in one of these six locations.

The iPad's wallpaper is displayed behind your app icons. You have the ability to customize this from within the Settings app. Customizing the Home screen's wallpaper is just one way you can personalize your iPad. How to do this is explained in Chapter 1.

#### ARRANGING ICONS ON THE HOME SCREEN

In addition to selecting your wallpaper graphic, you can determine the position of app icons on your Home screen. To move app icons around, hold down any onscreen app icon for 2 to 3 seconds, until all the icons on the Home screen start to shake.

Next, place your finger on any app icon that you want to move, and slowly drag it to a new position on the Home screen. You can move one app icon at a time, as long as the icons continue shaking. As you move apps around, all neighboring app icons automatically reflow on the Home screen.

During this process (shown in Figure I.6), some of the app icons display a small black-and-white "X" in the upper-left corner of the icon. You can delete the apps displaying the "X" from the iPad by tapping the "X" and then confirming your deletion request. However, you cannot delete the icons for the apps that came preinstalled on your tablet.

When you finish moving the icons around, press the Home button to exit out of this Home screen edit mode and save your changes. The icons stop shaking, and you can return to the normal use of your tablet.



When the app icons are shaking, you can delete the ones with an "X" icon. The icons without the "X" represent the apps that came preinstalled on your tablet.

#### CREATING FOLDERS TO ORGANIZE APP ICONS

On Your Home screen, it's possible to use folders in order to help organize your Home screen, group together apps based on their category, and remove clutter from your Home screen by consolidating the app icons that are displayed.

To create a folder, from the Home screen, press and hold down any app icon for two to three seconds. When all the app icons start to shake, pick one app icon that you want to place into a new folder. Hold your finger on that app icon, and slowly drag it directly on top of a second app icon that you want to also include within the folder you're creating.

When the two app icons overlap, a folder is automatically created. As soon as this happens, the other app icons on the Home screen fade slightly and a window containing the two apps in the newly created folder appears.

At the top of this window is a text field that contains a default name for the folder based on the category into which the two apps fall. You can keep this name by tapping anywhere on the screen outside the folder window. Alternatively, you can change the name of the folder by tapping the circular "X" icon that's displayed to the extreme right of the folder name field and then use the virtual keyboard to enter a new folder name.

To save your folder, tap anywhere outside the folder window. The newly created folder appears among your app icons on the Home screen. In Figure I.7, the folder is labeled Photography and it contains multiple apps.



When a folder appears on the Home screen, it displays alongside the app icons but looks slightly different. Thumbnails of the apps that are stored in the folder are shown in the folder icon.

After you initially create a folder, it contains two app icons. You can then add more app icons to it whenever all the app icons on the Home screen are shaking. Simply place your finger on the app icon you want to move into the folder and drag that icon on top of the folder icon.

When you're finished adding app icons to the folder, it's possible to move the folder around on the Home screen, just as you would move any app icon. Press the Home button to save your changes and return the Home screen to its normal appearance (causing the app icons to stop shaking).

To launch an app that's stored in a folder, from the Home screen tap the folder icon. When the folder window appears on the iPad's screen (as shown in Figure I.8), it displays all the app icons stored in the folder. Tap the icon for the app you want to use.

To remove an app icon from within a folder, from the Home screen tap the folder icon representing the folder in which the app is stored. When the folder window appears, hold your finger on the app icon that you want to move. When the app icons start to shake, drag the app icon out of the folder window and back onto the main Home screen.



Shown here is an open folder labeled Photography. It contains eight different apps.

If you want to delete an app from a folder and from the iPad altogether, when the icons are shaking, tap the black-and-white "X" icon in the icon's upper-left corner. All apps that you acquire for your iPad from the App Store are automatically stored within your free Apple iCloud online-based account, so they can be reinstalled onto your tablet at any time via the Internet. # USING ICLOUD WITH YOUR IPAD TO BACK UP AND SYNC DATA

iCloud is an online-based service operated by Apple that's designed to offer a wide range of features and functions to iOS mobile device and Mac users. (Some iCloud functionality is also offered to Windows PC users.)

As an iPad user, iCloud can be used for a wide range of tasks, the majority of which are offered to you free of charge. To begin taking advantage of what iCloud offers, you need to set up a free iCloud account, which takes just minutes, and it can be done using your existing Apple ID username and password.



**NOTE** Using iCloud in conjunction with your iPad (and other Macs and/or iOS mobile devices) is optional but recommended. However, if you're already taking advantage of a cloud-based service through your work, for example, and it's accessible from your iPad, you probably want to stick with that option and only use iCloud for specific tasks that don't overlap with the other cloud-based services you're using.

Just as the iOS operating system continues to evolve, so does iCloud. With the release of iOS 7, your iPad and the iCloud service can now be set up to:

- Sync app-specific data with your other iOS mobile devices (including your iPhone) and your Mac(s). This data also gets stored "in the cloud."
- Remotely store all of your iTunes Store, App Store, iBookstore, and Newsstand content purchases.
- Allow you to track the whereabouts of your iOS mobile devices and Macs.
- Sync data related to your web surfing activities using Safari, including your Bookmarks, Favorites Bar content, Reading List, as well as website-specific usernames and passwords.
- Maintain an online backup of your iPad.
- Create and store digital photos using My Photo Stream and Shared Photo Streams.
- Provide access to online versions of core iPad apps, including Contacts, Calendar, Reminders, Notes, Pages, Numbers, and Keynote through the iCloud.com website.

Once you set up a free iCloud account, the majority of iCloud's features and functions are designed to be turned on and activated once and then continue to work automatically and in the background.

An iCloud account includes 5GB of free online storage space for your backup files, iCloud-related email account data, app-specific synced data, and other content that you store online. However, all of the additional online storage space within your iCloud account that's needed for iTunes Store, App Store, iBookstore, or Newsstand purchases, or that's needed to maintain your My Photo Stream and/or Shared Photo Streams is automatically provided by Apple for free.

**NOTE** If additional iCloud online storage space is required, it can be purchased and become instantly available from your iPad. To do this, launch Settings, tap on the iCloud option, and then tap on the Storage & Backup option. From the Storage & Backup submenu, tap on the Buy More Storage option. An additional 10GB of online storage (giving you 25GB total) is priced at \$20.00 per year. For 20GB of additional online storage, the fee is \$40.00 per year, or for 50GB of online storage, the auto-recurring fee is \$100.00 per year.

For any iCloud-related function to work on your iPad, an Internet connection is required. While most of the available functions will work using either a cellular or Wi-Fi Internet connection, the iCloud Backup, My Photo Stream, and Shared Photo Stream features work only with a Wi-Fi connection. Plus, accessing certain types of past content purchases from your iCloud account that have large file sizes associated with them, such as TV shows and movies, also requires a Wi-Fi Internet connection.

**TIP** If you're a Windows PC user, app-specific data can be set up to sync data with compatible Windows software on your PC. To do this, however, it's necessary to download the free iCloud Control Panel software for windows. For example, Contacts, Calendar, Reminders, and Notes data can be set up to sync with Microsoft Outlook on a PC, and some Safari-related information on your iPad can sync with Internet Explorer on your PC. To download the Windows version of the iCloud Control Panel from your PC, visit http://support.apple.com/kb/DL1455.

# SET UP AN ICLOUD ACCOUNT

During the initial iPad activation and setup process, you'll be prompted to either enter your existing iCloud information or create a new iCloud account using your Apple ID and password (or another email address and a password you create). At anytime, however, you can set up a free Apple ID/iCloud account from your tablet when it's connected to the Internet.

To do this, launch Settings and tap on the iCloud option. Then, from the iCloud submenu, tap on the Get a Free Apple ID option (shown in Figure 12.1). However, if you already have an iCloud account set up for your Mac or iPhone, for example, enter your existing account information within the Apple ID and Password fields found near the top of the iCloud submenu within Settings, and then tap on the Sign In option.

You can create a new iCloud account (with a new Apple ID) directly from your iPad. However, you only need one account which can be used with all of your Macs, iOS mobile devices, and Apple TV.

**NOTE** If you already have an iCloud account set up to sync Contacts, Calendar, Reminders, Notes, Mail, Safari, Pages, Numbers, and/or Keynote appspecific data from your iPhone and/or Mac(s), as well as your My Photo Stream and Shared Photo Stream content, as soon as you enter your Apple ID and password within the iCloud submenu within Settings on your iPad, all of your applicable app-specific data automatically loads into your tablet and becomes accessible from the various apps on it.

As soon as you create a new iCloud account or sign in using your existing Apple ID and password (or preexisting iCloud account information), the iCloud submenu within Settings displays the iCloud submenu (shown in Figure 12.2). From here, you can turn on or off individual iCloud features, and in some cases, customize specific options related to iCloud features.

# TURN ON ICLOUD FEATURES FROM THE ICLOUD CONTROL PANEL

The iCloud Control Panel within Settings displays your iCloud Account username (email address) near the top of the screen. Keep in mind, when you created your iCloud account, an iCloud-related email address was automatically set up for you.

Displayed below your iCloud account information is a series of virtual switches that allow you to turn on or off specific iCloud features, including Mail, Contacts, Calendars, Reminders, Safari, Notes, Photos, Documents & Data, and Find My iPad.

While the new iCloud Keychain feature directly relates to Safari and maintaining a secure database of the website-specific usernames, passwords, and credit card details you use to make online purchases, this feature needs to be turned on separately. This is done from the Safari menu screen within Settings. Tap on the Passwords & AutoFill option and then turn on Names and Passwords and, if you choose, the Credit Cards feature as well.

**NOTE** Once you turn on the Documents & Data option from the iCloud Control Panel, it's still necessary to turn on iCloud functionality within each compatible app, including Pages, Numbers, and Keynote. See Chapter 13, "Getting Work Done On-the-Go Using the iWork Apps," for details on how to do this.

Even once Find My iPad is turned on, to be able to locate a lost or stolen tablet, it must be turned on and have access to the Internet. Otherwise, you can set up the Find My iPad service to alert you when the tablet is turned on by someone else and then decide whether you want a custom message displayed on the screen, the tablet to be locked down, or the contents of your tablet to be erased.

# SET UP ICLOUD TO SYNC APP-SPECIFIC DATA

From the iCloud submenu, you have the ability to turn on app-specific data and file syncing related to a handful of the core apps that come preinstalled with iOS 7. When the iCloud sync feature is turned on for an app, all of the content related to that app is automatically backed up "in the cloud," becomes accessible to you from the iCloud.com website. It can then automatically sync with all of your other Macs and iOS mobile devices that are linked to the same account.

Keep in mind, if you want your Contacts database to sync with the Contacts app running on your Mac(s), for example, it's necessary to turn on iCloud functionality on each of your Macs and link each Mac to the same iCloud account as your iPad (by logging in with the same iCloud username and password). Then, you must turn on the app-specific iCloud functionality for the Contacts app from the iCloud Control Panel on each of your Macs separately. Repeat this process for the other compatible apps, like Calendars, Reminders, and Notes.

**IIP** On a Mac, the iCloud Control Panel is accessed by launching System Preferences and then by clicking on the iCloud icon.

Likewise, if you want your iPad to sync app-specific data with your iPhone, it's necessary to access the iCloud submenu from Settings on your iPhone, sign in using the same iCloud account username and password, and then turn on the setting for each separate (and compatible) app that you want to sync with your iPad (Contacts, Calendar, Reminders, Mail, Safari, Notes, Keychain, Photos, etc.).

**CAUTION** Simply turning on iCloud-specific features only on your iPad will result in the specific apps syncing data with your online-based iCloud account, but unless you also turn on this functionality on your other Macs or iOS mobile devices, the data will not automatically sync with those other computers or devices.

# TURN ON THE ICLOUD BACKUP FEATURE

In addition to backing up and syncing app-specific data within your online-based iCloud account (which is definitely something you should do), it's possible to set up iCloud to automatically create and maintain a backup of your tablet's other content, personalized settings, and data.

To turn on and begin using the iCloud Backup feature, launch Settings, tap on the iCloud option, and then from the iCloud Control Panel scroll down toward the bottom of the screen and tap on the Storage and Backup option.

From the Storage and Backup submenu (shown in Figure 12.3), turn on the virtual switch associated with iCloud Backup. This only needs to be done once. Now, once per day, as long as your iPad is in sleep mode, has access to a Wi-Fi Internet connection (a cellular data connection will not work), and the tablet is plugged into an external power source, a backup of your tablet will automatically be created or updated and stored "in the cloud" within your iCloud account.

As long as you're maintaining a backup of your iPad, you can Restore your tablet using these backup files should something go wrong. The Restore process can be done on your existing iPad or on a replacement iPad, as long as a Wi-Fi Internet connection is present.

**TIP** Once the iCloud Backup feature is turned on, it's possible to manually create a backup (or update the existing backup). To do this, launch Settings, tap on the iCloud option, access the Storage and Backup submenu, and then tap in the Back Up Now option. Displayed below this option, you'll see the time and date when the last successful backup was created.

From the Storage and Backup submenu within Settings, it's possible to set up and activate the iCloud Backup feature, plus initiate a manual backup of your tablet.

Once iCloud Backup is turned on, to manually create an online backup of your tablet at anytime, launch Settings, tap on the iCloud option, and then tap on The Storage & Backup option. Next, tap on the Back Up Now option (refer to Figure 12.3). In addition, be sure you have iCloud set up to sync app-specific data from Contacts, Reminders, Notes, Safari, and so on.

**NOTE** Unless you're using the iTunes Sync process to maintain a backup of your iPad (which is still a viable option), be sure to turn on the iCloud Backup feature and take advantage of it. One difference between iCloud Backup and iTunes Sync is that while the iCloud Backup files are stored online ("in the cloud"), iTunes Sync backup files are stored on your primary computer's hard drive. Thus, if you need to Restore the tablet, it will need to be connected to your primary computer. Whereas you can Restore an iPad using an iCloud Backup from almost anywhere.

# SET UP AND USE THE FIND MY... FEATURE

To set up the Find My iPad feature on your tablet, launch Settings, tap on the iCloud option, and then from the iCloud Control Panel turn on the virtual switch that's associated with the Find My iPad feature.

Now, at any point, if your iPad gets lost or stolen, you have two options. From your iPhone (or another iPad), use the free Find My iPhone app to pinpoint the location of your tablet. Or, it's possible to access the iCloud.com website, log in using your iCloud account username and password, and then click on the Find My iPhone icon.

Whichever method you use, as long as your tablet is turned on (or in sleep mode) and it has access to the Internet (via a cellular or Wi-Fi connection), a detailed map will display the location of all Apple Macs and iOS mobile devices you have linked to your iCloud account.

The green dot(s) on the map indicate the locations of your devices. You can zoon in on the map to view more detail, select an alternate map view (Standard, Satellite, or Hybrid), or click on one of the dots to access additional features. From the banner that's displayed above the green dot you click on, you can see the name of the device and when it was last located. Tap on the Info ("i") icon to view a new menu window that offers three additional options (shown in Figure 12.4).

Depending on the Apple computer or device that's being tracked by the Find My... feature, these options include: Play Sound, Lock (Mac), Lost Mode (iOS device), and Erase.

The Play Sound option will cause the missing computer or device to emit a sound to help you locate it. The Lock option (available for Macs) allows you to lock down your Mac with a password to keep unauthorized people from accessing it.

The Lost Mode option (available for iOS mobile devices) allows you to create and activate a Passcode feature, which will prevent anyone from using the device without the proper code. You'll also have the option to enter a phone number (which will be displayed on the phone's screen, so the person who finds it can contact you). A custom message (asking for the iPad to be returned, for example) can also remotely be set up to display on the tablet's screen.

The Erase option allows you to remotely erase all content on the lost or stolen computer or device. Once the iPad, for example, is recovered, you can then Restore it using iCloud Backup for the iTunes Sync process, assuming you've maintained a backup.

# TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE ICLOUD.COM WEBSITE

The newly designed iCloud.com website can be accessed for free by pointing any web browser to www.iCloud.com. Sign in to the service using your iCloud username and password. Then, from the iCloud website's main menu (shown in Figure 12.5), it's possible to use the online version of the Mail, Contacts, Calendar, Notes, Reminders, Pages, Numbers, or Keynote apps or access the Find My iPhone feature.

When you launch any of the online apps, all of your synced data from your iCloud account will be available to you. For example, if you launch the online version of Contacts, it will be populated with all of your Contacts database entries.

**TIP** You can access the iCloud.com website from any computer (a PC or Mac) that's connected to the Internet, whether or not that computer is linked to your iCloud account. However, if you're using someone else's computer to access your iCloud account and use the online apps that are populated with your data, be sure to sign off from the service when you're done. To do this, click on your username that's displayed near the top-right corner of the iCloud.com browser window and then click on the Sign Off option.

Online versions of Contacts, Calendar, Maps, Reminders, Notes, Pages, Numbers, and Keynote, as well as Find My iPhone, are available for free from the iCloud.com website.

One benefit of using the Pages, Numbers, and Keynote online apps is that you can literally drag and drop a Microsoft Office document or file into one of these apps, and it is automatically converted into a Pages, Numbers, or Keynote document of file and then become accessible using Pages, Numbers, or Keynote on your iPad (or any Mac or iOS mobile device that's linked to your iCloud account). So, if you use Microsoft Word on your PC or Mac and the Pages word processor on your iPad, you can easily export a Word document from your computer using the online edition of Pages, and it syncs with your iPad and is available as a Pages document. You can then view, edit, print, or share the document or export it back into Word format.

**NOTE** The online editions of Mail, Contacts, Calendar, Notes, Reminders, Pages, Numbers, and Keynote work almost identically as their iOS 7 counterparts that run on the iPad.

# ACCESS ALL ITUNES STORE CONTENT PURCHASES VIA ICLOUD

As soon as you create an iCloud account using your Apple ID and password, all previous, current, and future content purchases from the iTunes Store, iBookstore, App Store, and Newsstand are automatically saved within your iCloud account. This includes your music, TV show episodes, movies, audiobooks, ringtones, eBooks, apps, and digital publications.

Using the iTunes Store, App Store, iBooks, or Newsstand apps, you can then access previous purchases that were acquired using the same Apple ID, regardless of which of your Macs or iOS mobile devices originally accessed the content. The storage of your iTunes Store and related content purchases within your iCloud account happens automatically, and this does not utilize any of the 5GB of free online storage space that's provided to you by Apple.

From within Settings, it's possible to turn on the Automatic Downloads option, which allows your iPad to automatically download music, apps, and app updates, regardless of which Mac or iOS mobile device (that's also linked to your iCloud account) that the content was purchased on. To turn on this feature, launch Settings; tap on the iTunes & App Store option; and then from the iTunes & App Store submenu turn on the virtual switches associated with Music, Apps, and/or Updates that are displayed under the Automatic Downloads heading.

**TIP** In addition to backing up and allowing you to sync your music that's purchased from the iTunes Store, if you upgrade to the iTunes Match service (\$24.95 per year), your entire digital music collection, including music you've acquired from other sources or "ripped" from your audio CDs, can be stored online and synced between all of your Mac(s), iOS mobile devices, and Apple TV.

# **CLOUD-BASED ALTERNATIVES TO ICLOUD**

The benefit to using iCloud in conjunction with your iPad is that the iOS 7 operating system, many of the core apps that come preinstalled with your tablet, as well as a growing number of other apps, all offer seamless iCloud integration. Plus, the iCloud service can be used to handle a wide range of tasks, many of which have been described in this chapter.

There are, however, many other cloud-based services in cyberspace that can be used in conjunction with an iPad. Some of these services have specialized apps

available from the App Store. For example, there's Dropbox, which is a popular file sharing, backup, and syncing service that can also be used to store and share photos.

Amazon offers a cloud-based service that can be used for managing your music library online and on your iPad, while Microsoft offers its free SkyDrive service (and iPad app) that can be used for backing up, storing, and sharing certain types of Microsoft Office and related data and files, particularly if you're an Office 365 user.

If you utilize Adobe creative software on your Mac or PC, plus use the Photoshop Touch app on your tablet, it's possible to take advantage of Adobe's Creative Cloud service to sync, back up, and share Adobe-related files. Meanwhile, if you already use Google Docs, for example, there are a handful of apps (including Google Drive and GoDocs for Google Drive & Google Docs) for the iPad that allow you to access and utilize these popular online-based apps.

Moving forward, there's one thing that's certain, and it's that more and more features and functions of the iPad, as well as the apps you're using with your tablet, are sure to have greater reliance on cloud-based computing services and technologies. As a result, continued expansion and improvements to Apple's iCloud service, as well as other popular cloud services, should be expected in the months and years to come.
