## Introduction

Welcome to the *Top 100 Windows 8.1 Apps*. That's both the title of this book and the description of what's inside—sort of.

I say sort of because there are more than 100 apps listed in this book. Oh, there are exactly 100 recommended apps, but there are another 200 or so honorable mentions. So there are a lot of apps to choose from, if that's what you're looking for.

And I presume that quality apps are indeed what you're looking for. There are tens of thousands of apps in Microsoft's Windows Store, with more added every day. Some of these apps are truly great; many are good; most are average; and more than a handful really stink. This book is all about separating the wheat from the chaff, as it were, and helping you discover the *best* apps in any given category.

## **Understanding Windows 8.1 Apps**

Starting with Windows 8, and continuing into Windows 8.1, Microsoft introduced us to a new Modern interface. This tile-based, full-screen, touch-centric interface works quite well on tablets and a little less well on traditional notebook and desktop PCs. Whether or not you like it, however, it's what we now have to call normal, so you better get used to it. 'Nuff said.

Part and parcel of the Modern interface are Modern apps. These are apps that run in full-screen mode and perform specific tasks. (Don't confuse them with traditional desktop apps, which still exist but aren't what we're talking about here.)

Microsoft includes a handful of these Modern apps with the new operating system, and some of these built-in apps are quite good. Other apps, from Microsoft and third-party publishers, are available in the Windows Store. You get to the Windows Store by clicking the Store tile on the Windows Start screen. Once there, you can browse or search for apps and download the ones you like.

Many Modern apps are free, but others cost real money. Fortunately, most paid apps are relatively inexpensive—typically only a few bucks each. That makes Modern apps far more affordable than old-school desktop software, which typically runs in the three figures.

## **How to Find New Apps**

The only place to find Windows 8.1 apps is in the Windows Store. It's kind of like how Apple does apps for its iPhone and iPad; you do all your purchasing from the relevant app store.

The easiest way to find the apps discussed in this book is to search for them. You could browse the Store categories and hope to trip over a given app, but it's just as likely that the one I recommend won't pop up first in the category list.

So use the Store's search function (it's the search box at the top right of every Store page) and search for an app by name. Make sure you get the specific app, as many apps have similar names. When in doubt, look at the app publisher in addition to the app title.

## **How This Book Is Organized**

I've organized this book the same way that the Windows Store is organized. (That's after an introductory chapter that tells you all about Modern apps, of course.) There are 20 categories in the Store, so there are 20 app chapters (plus the introductory one) in this book. Simple enough.

That's not to say, however, that Microsoft's Store categories always make sense or are consistent. I can't help it if the geniuses at the Microsoft mothership put an app in a category that doesn't quite fit. I chose to be consistent with Microsoft's organization, even if it isn't completely consistent with itself.

Within each Store category, I then came up with categories of my own. That's how we get 100 categories out of the 20-category Store. In the Social category, for example, I devised 8 separate app categories—Best Facebook App, Best Twitter App, Best Texting App, and so forth. I hope that my more focused categories prove more useful to you.

## **How I Picked the Apps**

Within each focused category, I offer a single recommended app. This is the app I like best, pure and simple. It may be the most popular app in the category, in terms of downloads, or it may not. It's just the one I find that does the best job.

After the recommended app I often offer a few honorable mentions in a given category. These are apps that are also worth your consideration, and that some people might like better than my main recommendation.

By the way, not all of my recommended apps are free. If two apps are functionally identical, I tend to recommend the free or lower-cost one, but otherwise I just went for what's best, not what's cheapest. (And sometimes that's the app that Microsoft bundled with Windows—go figure!)

## **Keeping Up to Date**

You should also know that publishers are constantly adding new apps to the Windows Store. That's good; there's always something new to consider. I chose the best apps available as of the beginning of 2014, but no doubt there will be some newer and better apps available by the time you read this book. That's just the way it goes.

(For that matter, it's likely that some of the apps I recommend will get updated over time. Hopefully that will make them even better.)

If you want to keep up with all the latest apps in the Windows Store, look for my monthly New Windows Apps articles on the Que Publishing website (www. quepublishing.com). Each month I focus on the best new apps released to the Store. You should find it useful.

Finally, know that I made every effort to present accurate and up-to-date information in this book. It's possible a few mistakes crept in, or that things changed from when I wrote the original text. That happens, and I apologize in advance for issues you may encounter.

Everybody has to eat. Whether you're cooking at home or eating out, you can use your Windows computer to help you find healthy and delicious choices for your next meal. There's even a food and drink app included free with Windows 8.1!

## **Best Recipe App**

Whether you're into simple home cooking or you're a budding gourmet chef, you need the right recipes to be successful. Fortunately, there are a number of recipe apps in the Windows Store, and they're all worth checking out.

## **Allrecipes**

The quality of a recipe app rests on how good its recipes are, and the **Allrecipes** app features some very good recipes, indeed. This one comes from the folks at the Allrecipes website and features tens of thousands of different recipes, which you search for via ingredient. That is, you choose one or more primary ingredient, and Allrecipes lists recipes that use that ingredient.

You can also search the Allrecipes database, using Windows' built-in search function. Just press Windows+Q, enter your query, and see matching recipes. It's a faster way to look for Shrimp Etoufee or Orange Chicken.

Each recipe is rated by other users, so you have some idea whether it's any good or not. At the top of every recipe you see a summary that lists prep time, cook time, total time, calories, total fat, and cholesterol numbers. You can also adjust the recipe for different serving sizes, and save your favorite recipes for easy access in the future.



As good—and as popular—as Allrecipes is, there are lots of other recipe apps in the Windows Store worth checking out. Let's start with **Everyday Food**, from the Martha Stewart conglomerate, which takes the same ingredient-based approach as the Allrecipes app. What I like about this one are the videos that demonstrate various cooking techniques. Hey, some of us need all the help we can get in the kitchen!

**Allthecooks Recipes** boasts more than 150,000 different recipes in its massive database, which is built on user submissions. (You can even submit your own recipes, directly from the app.) What's nice about this one is the vibrant Allthecooks community, which you access via the discussion forums built into the app. It's kind of a one-stop-shop for socially involved cooks,



Finally, don't dismiss the **Bing Food & Dining** app included free with Windows 8.1, which features lots of good recipes from a variety of sources. You can browse recipes by cooking method, course, cuisine, dietary requirements, difficulty, family, major ingredients, special occasion, or total time. The app also includes lots of videos demonstrating cooking tips and techniques, as well as information about and recipes from a number of celebrity chefs, including Wolfgang Puck, Tom Colicchio, and Marcus Samuelsson. Because you already have this one installed on your Windows 8 PC, you might as well check it out—you'll probably like it.

## **Best Reservations App**

Do you like fine dining? Or do you prefer something more casual? Whatever type of food you like, if you want to guarantee a table at your favorite restaurant, you'll need to make reservations—which you can do from within Windows.


## **OpenTable**

When it comes to making reservations online, OpenTable pretty much owns the category. The **OpenTable** app does everything that the website and mobile app do—that is, schedule reservations at all your favorite restaurants.

By default, the app displays panels for those restaurants closest to your current location. It's a snap, however, to enter a different location, along with desired time and date for your dining. You can also go directly to any given restaurant, just by entering the restaurant's name.

When you search for restaurants by location, you see a list of matching restaurants along with when they have tables free. Click a restaurant to see more information, read the menu, and make a reservation. All the reservations are within the app, no phone calls or emails necessary.

## **Best Restaurant Review App**


After you've visited a restaurant (after using the OpenTable app for reservations, of course), why not let other diners know what you think of the joint? Not surprisingly, there are apps for that.

In the world of online crowd-sourced restaurant reviews, Urbanspoon is king. Its vast user base of diners ensures that most major restaurants are covered, and you'd be surprised how detailed most of the reviews are. I always check Urbanspoon before I make reservations at a place I haven't eaten at before.

Now you can access all of the site's reviews from the **Urbanspoon** app. There are a number of different ways to browse for restaurants—by cuisine, critic's picks, bargain gems, price, even what's currently open nearby. Press Windows+Q to search for specific restaurants, then create your own list of favorite establishments.

After you land on a page for a given restaurant, you see the ratings percentage (X% of users liked the place), user-submitted photos, pricing and offerings, and user reviews. Click or tap the Write a Review icon to write your own review and make it visible to the rest of the Urbanspoon community.

Obviously, the more popular the restaurant the more reviews it will have. And your tastes may differ from those of other Urbanspoon users. But when you want to know as much as you can about a restaurant, the Urbanspoon app is hard to beat.



Yelp is Urbanspoon's biggest competitor in online restaurant reviews, and although there is no official Yelp app for Windows 8.1 (at least not yet), there are two apps that use the Yelp database. In addition to being able to find restaurants by searching or browsing a map for a given location, the **FoodGraphic** app provides a variety of visualizations to help you compare different restaurants. For example, you can graph ratings, reviews, and distance for selected establishments—and even compare rating versus distance and rating versus reviews. It's a nontraditional approach that appeals to data hounds.

The **Zalp** app takes a more traditional approach to finding specific restaurants; you can search by either name or location. What you get in return are Yelp ratings and Zagat scores for that location. Click the Yelp or Zagat logo to open the respective websites, or click the restaurant's logo to go to its site.

## **Best Wine and Cocktails App**

Want to make the perfect martini? How about something fancier, like a red rooster or Alabama slammer? Yeah, you know the answer—there's an app for that.

The very best cocktails app for Windows 8.1 is **Cocktail Flow**. You can browse recipes by type of alcohol (whiskey, vodka, rum, and so on), color, and type (classic, exotic, and so forth). Press Windows+Q to search for specific cocktails.

Each recipe gives you a nice picture of the finished product, a list of ingredients, and the necessary step-by-step mixing instructions. You even get a list of similar cocktails, which is nice for finding new drinks.

The Cocktail Flow app also lets you manage your bar inventory, as well as create a list of your favorite drinks. There are a few single-screen "bar guides" with very basic information, but these are better skipped if you know your stuff.

Bottom line, you use Cocktail Flow to learn how to concoct a variety of interesting and tasty alcoholic beverages. It's good for that.



The **Bing Food & Dining** app included with Windows 8.1 is also pretty useful for home mixologists. With the Cocktails section you can browse recipes by difficulty, flavor profile, glass, and ingredients, and the Wine section displays wines by category, region, type, and varietal. There's a lot of good information here, and it's already installed on your PC.

Then there's the **BarStack** app, which lets you manage all aspects of your home bar. When you go shopping, add your recently purchased ingredients to your inventory. You can then let BarStack analyze what you have on hand to determine what drinks you can make. Kind of neat.
